It's the last Friday of the school month so students have a FREE Dress Day.




#### Scholastic Book Fair Week


#### **Band Winter Concert**

## Perseverance

Resource for Families

SEL Core Competencies: Self Management & Growth Mindset

### what is perseverance?

Showing perseverance means not giving up when things get difficult or when success doesn't come easy.

Why do we need to practice perseverance?

"If you can't fly, then run.

If you can't run, then walk. If you can't walk, then crawl, but whatever you do, you have to keep moving forward."

- Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr Research on the brain shows that the prefrontal cortex is not fully developed until our mid to late 20's. The prefrontal cortex is the region of our brain that is responsible for our higher order thinking skills (cause and effect, impulse control, problem solving, etc.). The development of the prefrontal cortex is not like that of a light switch. There is no flip of the switch and suddenly a person is capable of high-order thinking skills. Like anything, for the prefrontal cortex to develop, there needs to be explicit learning opportunities.

What does this mean?

Provide time everyday for creation and application of opportunities for your child to practice responsibility.

## Let's Practice perseverance! what can you do at home?

- Set small and achievable goals. Each time your child meets their goal, set a new goal. Setting and achieving goals will help develop their prefrontal cortex. The skills they learn about perseverance will help them realize they are capable of achieving their goals.
- At the end of each school day, have your child share an example of something they struggled to accomplish that day. Brainstorm ways to make that struggle more productive the next time they face it.
- Share with your child examples of your own struggles and how you persevered.
